

To mark fabric, use method that will come out with water or heat.

On piece of pink fabric, trace shell pattern. (This is your stitching line and will be the "wrong side" of your shell.)

On the other side of this same piece of pink fabric, line up shell and trace only the internal shell lines. (These will be quilting lines, and this will be the "right side" of your shell.)

If you're going to embroider your name across the top of the shell by hand, you may want to do this now. Or, if you're going to machine-embroider your name, you can wait till all 3 layers are together. (NAME SHOULD BE EMBROIDERED LEGIBLY ACROSS TOP OF NAMETAG.)

Layer the 2 pieces of pink fabric together with the piece of batting on the bottom. (Be sure that the "wrong side" of your pink shell is showing.)

Leaving an opening of about 1-1/2" for turning right side out, sew these 3 layers together on the stitching line or "wrong side" of your shell.

Trim excess fabric about 1/4 inch from your sewing line and clip the curves.

Turn right side out, gently nudging scallops to form the shape of the shell.

Close the 1-1/2" opening with a slip stitch. Press.

Quilt as desired. (You can quilt as many of the shell lines as desired and can also go stitch around the edge.)

Ribbon is enclosed for strap to go around your neck.
